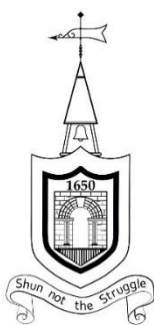

Following our usual policy, please be aware that if your child wins a bottle of alcohol on the Bottle Bola we always ask that an adult collects the prize from the stall. There will be a 'pram park' just inside the main entrance of school for buggies, push chairs and prams to ease the flow of 'traffic' in the hall and corridors.



Anyone who has volunteered to help will be receiving a slip before the Fair to let them know which stall they will be helping on.

Car Parking - Despite many requests and reminders, there are **STILL** parents and carers and other adults who are parking in the school car park to drop off and collect children from school or Nursery. This is causing great difficulty for those parents, carers and other family members who have a disabled child or who are disabled themselves and also for staff. A number of members of our school family have a valid reason for parking in the school car park, which is **only** for staff, visitors and people who have a current disabled driver's permit. Please could we ask that you **do not** use the school car park unless you have a genuine reason for doing so. Some members of staff and parents and carers have also expressed concerns about 'poor parking' in the Council car park between school and the Community Centre. Please do not park in the unmarked tarmac area near the entrance to the car park. Drivers who are parking in unmarked spaces are creating a hazard for other cars trying to enter and leave the car park. **Thank you for your support in this matter.**
